



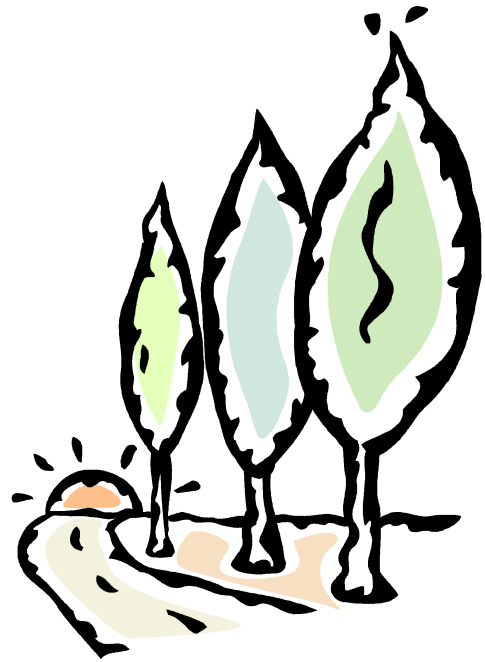
Membership Enrollment Kit

Welcome

The Path to Membership is a Journey to Deeper Commitment —

Church membership represents a deeper connection with your faith community. To help you discern whether or not *UU Fellowship of Corvallis* membership is right for you, we encourage you to attend the **Newcomer Orientation and Path to Membership class** (offered quarterly). Also, a variety of adult Religious Exploration classes are offered from time to time, and you are welcome to borrow books from our library at any time.

Membership is both simple and difficult. You are required only to be at least 18 years of age, sign the Membership Book, and make a minimum financial or service pledge. It is challenging because of what this simple act means: that a person has made a decision to join a faith community that is searching for truth, working for justice, and whose members would live in loving relationship with one another. It also means making a commitment to the financial health and stability of the church. Before you join, please carefully read this booklet. Then, complete the three forms at the back and bring them to the Enrollment Ceremony. **We look forward to welcoming you as a member.**



Seeking

Highly Committed Members —

Since its founding in 1948, generations of highly committed members have worked selflessly to create what you experience at The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Corvallis today: a dynamic and liberal community of faith devoted to personal spiritual growth and to social justice in our world.

Carefully consider the responsibilities of Membership before you make the commitment. Members readily and generously give their time, talents and financial resources to support the Fellowship Mission (*see box*)—because they want to. Because this is their chosen church home. This spirit of generosity and commitment develops over time, and is the result of active participation in our programs. This is what is meant by *high commitment members*. *Are you prepared to make this kind of commitment?*

Getting Started

Four Steps to Membership —



1. Attend the Path to Membership class (offered throughout the year).
sign up at Welcome Table.



2. Complete Enrollment Forms at the end of this Kit; each individual age 18 years or older is eligible for Membership.



3. Sign the Membership Record Book. An Enrollment Ceremony is offered after most Path to Membership classes. During this brief ceremony, you will sign the *Membership Record Book* and meet other new members. You may also arrange to sign the Membership Book with the minister by appointment.

4. Make your pledge

Getting Involved—Membership With Meaning

Attending the worship service on Sunday is a very special experience, but most members find that, over time, it is not enough to sustain their commitment to the church.

We know of no better way to deepen your connection, as well as increase your reward, than by active engagement in a church program that most closely matches your needs. Don't wait! Find a group, program or activity in which to involve yourself as soon as possible. This is how you will start "feeling a part of" the church, and in return, the people of First Church will become a community for you. Pick up a copy of the *Committees, Interest Groups, Annual Events and Volunteer Opportunities* guide, and review the many ways to get involved. Here's a small sampling of the opportunities for personal and spiritual growth:

- Committees: Membership and Hospitality, Women's Retreat, Worship Associates, Environmental Action, Peace Action Council, Finance, Budget, Communications, Food Bank, etc.

Enrollment Forms to be Completed Before Joining

1. **New Member Information form:** Please print clearly. This information becomes part of our data base. Each individual (age 18 and over) who wants to join must complete her/his own set of forms.

2. **Gifts and Talents survey:** Here, you have an opportunity to match your unique experiences, interests, and talents with some of the programs, committees and activities of this church. Please indicate two or three areas that interest you. This information also becomes part of our data base, and is referred to from time to time. Our program staff also reviews your interests. We encourage you to seek out groups, programs and activities which appeal to you, and to get involved as soon as possible. 3. **Pledge form:** Return of this card is required to be eligible to vote, chair committees, hold office within the Fellowship, or represent the Fellowship at UUA or Northwest UU meetings.

Please bring the *three completed forms at the end of this Kit to your Enrollment Ceremony.*

There are held quarterly after the Newcomer Orientation and Path To Membership session, (sign up at the Welcome Desk) or by appointment with the minister.

During the Ceremony, you will have a chance to meet other new members, and to sign our *Membership Record Book*. We'll also take your photo for our records. Having taken the Path to Membership class is an important step before you join.

We look forward to welcoming you into the community of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Corvallis.

Our UU Principles and Sources

We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote:

1. The inherent worth and dignity of every person
2. Justice, equality and compassion in human relations
3. Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregation
4. A free and responsible search for truth and meaning
5. The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large
6. The goal of world community with peace, liberty and justice for all
7. Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

The living tradition we share draws from many sources:

- Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- Words and deeds of prophetic women and men which challenge us to confront powers and struc-

tures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;

- Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- Spiritual teachings of earth-centered traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.

These principles and sources of faith are the backbone of our religious community

We covenant to provide:

- thoughtful and celebrative worship services
- religious education for all ages
- rites of passage
 - child dedication
 - coming of age
 - weddings and services of union
 - memorial services
- pastoral care and counseling
- community through social and educational events and service opportunities
- a variety of ongoing support and interest groups

We ask that you:

- actively pursue your own spiritual path
- contribute your time and talents to the life of the institution
- make an appropriate financial pledge in accordance with your means. Our most committed members have set a goal of 5% of their income for support of the church.

More About Your Pledge

It's your Financial Promise to the Fellowship

Members annually pledge to support this Fellowship with their financial and/or service resources. Unitarian Universalist congregations are self-sustaining institutions; their primary source of financial support comes from church members and other congregants who faithfully participate in the life of the Fellowship.

Generosity is a spiritual Practice.

We recognize one of the truths of all the world's great religions: that *generosity* is central to a healthy spiritual life. We believe in the ancient practice of *giving* as a spiritual exercise, used like any other meditation practice to deepen and strengthen the soul. Members of this Fellowship who give generously—to this church and elsewhere—tell of the joy and empowerment they feel when they live out of a sense of abundance. Our faith calls us to welcome the stranger at the door, to share our resources with others in need, and to care for our planet. As Unitarian

Universalists, we believe it is the right and responsibility of each local congregation to govern itself. There is no centralized authority that supports us financially, nor does it tell us what to do or what to believe. Each UU congregation is self-sustaining: our primary source of financial support comes from our members who make financial gifts to the church. As a group of people covenanted together, we believe a healthy church is the responsibility of all members. We also know that if this Fellowship and this faith are to live into the future for our children and grandchildren, we must care for this institution, and keep it strong.



Members Renew Their Pledge Annually

At the time that a new member joins the Fellowship, he or she agrees as a condition of membership to contribute generously within his or her means to the annual operating fund. The pledge you make upon joining is for the remainder of the current calendar year (ending June 30). Then, each year during our annual fund drive you will be asked, along with all other congregants, to make a *new* pledge for the *next* calendar year.

While our average household pledge currently is approximately \$1200, the current *minimum pledge required to support your membership* is less than \$100 annually. You may arrange to substitute a certain number of hours of service if this minimum financial pledge is a hardship. (See Gifts and Talents)

Think about this: what would you expect to pay for dinner out with the family, or a subscription to premium channels? Certainly, UUFC exercises your mind, and feeds your soul and spirit. How much would you pay for such a feast? What is it worth to you? These are questions of spirit and generosity, and we ask you to carefully consider this important aspect of Membership.

We can focus upon abundance when we truly learn to trust, to “have faith,” in our values and in one another as persons who share a commitment to stay together and share in those struggles. Then we know that there will be enough for all as we share our scarce resources and generate abundance.

**You May Use Automatic Withdrawal for Your Monthly Pledge Payment
...or Your Credit or Debit Card**

You will be completing a Pledge Form. Please consider using automatic withdrawal from your checking account. For Automatic Withdrawal, simply submit a voided check with your form. Since there is no fee for this transaction— and it saves time in our accounting department— more of your dollar goes to work for the church with this method of payment. Or, you may indicate your credit or debit card number (please note that 2.55% of all credit card transactions goes to the bank, not to the church; consequently this amount will be added to your charges.) You may also write a check weekly, monthly or annually.

IMPORTANT: In order for us to keep a record of your pledge, please submit *each* pledge contribution clearly labeled with your name. Cash placed in the weekly offering basket is impossible for us appropriately credit— unless you place the cash in an envelope with your name on it. Statements are issued throughout the year to let you know where you stand regarding your pledge. If you have questions about your pledge, please call the church office, 541-752-5218, during normal business hours.

- Members may pledge individually, or as households or family units. The choice is up to you.
- The other enrollment forms in this kit must be completed by each individual who wishes to join.

Monthly Pledging Guideline for Members:

Here are some examples using your household income, and showing giving categories stated on a monthly basis. Please note that these are only a guideline to help you assess your giving potential.

- ☐ The **Supporter** is 2% of your annual income. *“The church is a significant part of my life and promotes my spiritual growth.”*
- ☐ The **Sustainer** is 3% to 4% of your annual income. *“The church is central to my identity and I am committed to the present and future growth of the church.”*
- ☐ The **Benefactor** is a “Liberal Tithe” of 5% of your annual income. *“The church has transformed me and I believe that a liberal tithe will allow the church to transform others.”*
