And the kids will have a great time, for free. Remember, this is not only a fund-raiser, but also a major social event.
- *I can't be there that night.* You don't have to be there to donate. To be in the program, all donations must be submitted by Sunday, April 12th, at the very latest. To buy, engage a friend to act as your proxy in the bidding for items you covet.
